A kiosk hosting the association's boutique and where the general public is welcomed (especially during weekly visits).




PRESENTATION

- **ENVIRONMENT** : Implementation of actions combining science, nature, and culture to better understand and protect the Polynesian marine environment.



CARE PROTOCOL

- Pursuit of the **CARE** and **REEDUCATION PROTOCOL** for the Rehabilitation center sea turtle residents.
- **MEDICAL SUPERVISION** of all residents: treatments, biometrics, food.

- **PROTECT** hatchlings during hatching phases.
- **ANALYZE** environmental parameters influencing **NESTING** and **HATCHING** success rate.
- **RAISE AWARENESS** of visitors and students.
