PRESENTATION



reinforce the association's strategy!



The everpresent blue hues echo our unbreakable connection with the ocean and our identity.

IMPACS PROJECT

The IMPACS Project (Knowledge and Conservation of Hawksbill Turtles in the South Pacific) aims at launching a long-term civic and scientific initiative for sea turtles (with a focus on hawksbill turtles) in two French territories of the South Pacific: Wallis and Futuna, and French Polynesia.

The overall objective is to reinforce the level of knowledge related to sea turtles in two French territories. It includes the creation of a synthesis of traditional knowledge on sea turtles, a network of participatory sciences comprising events and trainings in the various territories, and a common scientific program in French Polynesia and Wallis and Futuna, which will be initiated with the aim of collecting data on nesting female green and hawksbill turtles homogeneously..

Length of the project: 2024-2026 (18 months)



SATELLITE TRACKING

In 2024, Te mana o te moana was mandated by the DIREN to make a synthesis of sea turtle satellite tracking in French Polynesia from 2006 onwards. This research service aims at recovering, homogenizing and analyzing all data coming from beaconed individuals to better understand and characterize their behaviors at sea and use the oceanographic structures of their migrating strategies.

This synthetic work was made possible thanks to the collaboration and availability of data from NOAA and the DIREN. The data of 41 individuals equipped with satellite beacons were analyzed.

PROJECT REPORT: The results demonstrate that most nesting adult green turtles on Tetiaroa follow a trans-Pacific East to West migration towards Fiji, supposed to be their feeding area.






FIGURE 4 - Schéma de migration des 41 individus balisés depuis la Polynésie française

ACOUSTIC BEACONING PROJECT

- Authorization granted by the Direction of the Environment of French Polynesia (DIREN) for the acoustic beaconing of JUVENILES and SUB-ADULT SEA TURTLES
- Analysis of the MIGRATION and DISTRIBUTION OF SEA TURTLES in the lagoon of Tetiaroa
- Use of ACOUSTIC RECEPTORS already set up in the lagoon in the context of scientific projects

This project aims at evaluating the size of the sea turtle population, at identifying their favorite areas of distribution, and at analyzing their use of the lagoon as well as the external reef slopes on Tetiaroa.

The first results demonstrate important densities of juvenile turtles at times in certain areas of the reef. This project aims at confirming the hypothesis, whereby the lagoon's food resources constitute a sanctuary for green turtles of the region. This information is essential to the development of management and conservation initiatives, especially since no study has ever been conducted in French Polynesia regarding habitat use by immature green turtles.


In 2024, **11** immature sea turtles of the Tetiaroa lagoon were equipped by our team with an acoustic beacon.

The Project "MAI TO'U AROA'EI TO'U TAIROTO: From my District to the Lagoon" aims at raising awareness across all ages on the issues of pollution and lagoon preservation.

OBJECTIVES:

- ACCOMMODATING minors aged 6 to 18 years from priority districts in the context of a SPECIAL DAY-LONG EVENT of educational workshops to better understand the link between the districts, the lagoon and marine biodiversity



This year's edition of the Science Festival emphasized the topic of the Ocean.

2024's theme "Ocean of knowledge" consciously matched the Year of the Sea, taking place from September 2024 until September 2025, in conjunction with the 3rd United Nations Ocean Conference.

The Festival enabled to gather key players around this subject to sensitize various kinds of public, to favor knowledge sharing and exchanges between scientists and citizens, and to give each and everyone the possibility of taking ownership of the scientific evolutions' stakes and reach an active participation in the public debate.

To exercise this voice and bring it to the public, **Vahine Ahu'ura RURUA**, Polynesian archaeo-ichthyologist and researcher of the CIRAP, had been chosen as the **ambassador** of the Science Festival in French Polynesia.

This event started off the participation of French Polynesia to UNOC3 in 2025.




